Let's jump right in. This story unfolds in two main parts: The official story and the eyewitness accounts. These two perspectives tell two very different stories.

First, I'll give you the facts as presented to us by the authorities and the media concerning the events in this story. Then I'll go over the same incident as told to us by people who were there, footage posted online, and the social media hurricane that took place afterwards.

This is a very recent mystery that hinges on contradictions. To put it bluntly: the Party Line simply doesn't add up.

The official reports tell us that... On January 01, 2024, Between 7:45 and 8:30 pm, calls started to come in to 911 dispatchers, reporting disturbances at the Bayside Marketplace Mall on the western shore of Biscayne Bay in Miami... so on the downtown side (not the beach side).

Police reports indicate the calls concerned several teens fighting in the Margaritaville restaurant at the mall, that fireworks had been set off, and that a knife was seen.

Some 911 calls reported gunshots, but these turned out to also be fireworks, at least according to the media.

Police were sent to the mall to assist mall security who were having trouble containing the unruly kids.

Officer Michael Vega, a Miami police spokesman, told the Miami Herald that a small initial police response failed to contain the situation, so police called an alert known as a Citywide-3, which is a call for all available officers to respond to the scene.

This resulted in one of the largest police responses ever captured on video.

Official reports tell us that over 60 police vehicles descended on the mall. I myself counted 98 police cars in one of the most famous photos that looks to have been taken from a high floor of a condo across the street. I think that photo is from a video screenshot.

Streets surrounding the mall were roadblocked and in the end a grand total of 4 teens were arrested on charges of burglary, third-degree grand theft, battery, and resisting arrest without violence (so, running) according to their arrest reports.

The battery charges were for beating up a man who exited his car after someone threw a bottle at it as he drove past, and this happened after police were already on the scene.

This is the official story in a nutshell.

Some kids were fighting and throwing fireworks at a mall, cops came, the kids ran, and more cops came. A lot more.

So here are the things, in my opinion, that make sense about this so far.

First of all it's New Year's Day. New Year's Day is very likely a traditionally busy day for a mall like this. A lot of people are off of work, I guess some of the schools are probably closed so teenagers are out of school, because fireworks

are popular on New Year's Eve they might be more readily available to kids around this time, than they might be at other times of the year.

Anytime you have a bunch of teenagers together, particularly at night on a holiday weekend, and a holiday that traditionally involves fireworks, it's very likely that some mischief is going to go on. Kids like to fight, and sometimes police are called in to take care of just such a disturbance.

So up to this point all of that sounds perfectly logical. It's quite possible that this is all that happened there that night, which is what law enforcement and the news tell us.

But this brings us to the second part here, which are all of the things that call in to question this official narrative.

To be perfectly frank, this story just doesn't add up. Here's why.

XXXXXXXXXX

In this story there are several things that seem strange, and that's an understatement.

Before we get into specifics, I want to give you a better picture of what this mall is like.

The Bayside Marketplace Mall is a multi-story, open-air, cityplace-type shopping center with restaurants and retail built around a series of courtyards in Miami.

The best way to describe it is, imagine an old-school shopping mall from the 80s, but the hallways between the stores have no roof. The stores have roofs and the areas between them are paved with planters and fountains and benches, but many of those common areas are opened to the sky, often under frameworks of a gazebo-like structure overhead. Some of the hallways in the mall *are* covered, but even those are covered in a sort-of translucent greenhouse-type roof.

At first this seems like a strange design, but the strategy is that 1, the mall ownership doesn't have to pay to air-condition the entire space, and 2, the shops **are** air-conditioned, so in the Miami heat, this becomes a very real incentive for people to go inside the stores.

And this place is gorgeous. It flanks a marina where beautiful yachts dock, many of the restaurants overlook the water and the boats, there's a mojito bar, and an outdoor concert stage with views of the Miami Skyline.

The sensationalism of that night has somehow painted this place as a mall in the hood where teenagers go to fight, but the reality is that this is a very bougee

shopping center, on some of the most expensive real estate in the country. It costs \$30 to park there for the day.

And because it's this sort of system of indoor areas enclosing outdoor hallways and courtyards, there really aren't doors, to go in or out of the mall, as it were.

There are many places where you can access the interior spaces and stairways and corridors that give people access to the stores, bars, and restaurants scattered around, and many of the exteriors of the retail spaces face outward so they look across the marina or the street and you can walk along those without being (quote-unquote) inside the mall.

If groups of teenagers were running wild in this place, it would be virtually impossible to corral them because you can't just close the doors to the mall and trap them inside. There are no doors and there isn't an inside. It's just a series of buildings and landings and hallways and the spaces between them.

This is the scene.

Now let's talk about the things that just don't make sense.

The first thing is, this is, officially, the police responding to teens fighting.

Ok, fine. Where are all of the witness videos of this fight? A teenage fight breaks out on New Year's Night in a Miami mall, and not a single person films it with their phone, and puts it on social media? ... Impossible.

And when I say that's impossible, I mean it literally.

There is zero percent chance that a bunch of teenagers start fighting in a mall, in this day and age, and not a single other teenager films it.

This is like saying the Chicago Bears played the Green Bay Packers at Lambeau Field last week, and miraculously, not one of the fans in attendance that day wore a football jersey.

And yet no videos exist of a single fight from that night in the mall.

There are many videos of people running, (we'll get to that later) and videos of a hundred cop cars with lights flashing, but no videos of the fight that caused it all? Please.

One local news station, I think Miami's channel 10, **did** air footage of a bunch of teens fighting outside of a building while they reported on this story, but locals have said that footage was from some scuffle that occurred a couple years before outside of a movie theater. They recognize the movie theater exterior, and

remember seeing that same footage on the news back then. So not only did that video have nothing to do with the Bayside Marketplace fiasco, but it was from a totally different time, and a completely different place.

One girl who works at the mall said that there had been a few kids fighting that weekend, but that fight happened the day before. When asked why all the police came on the 1st she said, "Because of the Alien thing."

And this leads us to a few videos we do have. One filmed from a high-rise condo across the street shows what people say looks like a 10-foot tall shadow creature walking slowly along the front of the mall and it's as tall as the building façade.

It's hard to say what it is, but it looks huge and gangly and grey. Police claim it was 3 officers walking side-by-side, but how would that make them taller than the building? One article reports that witnesses said there were shadowy grey beings walking around, but that others on social media disagree, and say it was just 3 policemen walking side-by-side.

This is not true. That's what the police said after the fact, not shoppers who were there, and this is the kind of confusion reporting that stinks of a coverup.

I will say that there is a brief second in that video of something walking outside the mall, that is shot from the front, so the thing walking toward the camera, and from that angle it could be people walking abreast.

Two other things:

One, in that split second it looks like what appears to be stories of a building are actually wide steps up to a sculpture or something, and misreading these steps for building stories, makes the thing look way taller than it is, when the camera moves to view it from the side. And this camera moving from above the scene makes me think this is probably shot from a drone.

And two, no one in the scene seems to be reacting to this thing walking along. No one is pointing at it or running from it. Again this makes the case that this is policemen and not a giant creature.

But here is the thing about that which falls into the "not making sense" file here. No one on the scene ever said these creatures were walking around **outside** the mall, on the sidewalk.

People just added the creature idea to this video, which does seem like an optical illusion, after the fact. This video in question is actually a video of the insane police numbers at the mall. No one ever said it was of the creatures until this thing went viral.

Or this is a case of the mainstream media and the authorities, attaching the paranormal story here to something unrelated and totally explainable, in order to marginalize the real claims and testimonies of something out of the ordinary that night. Right?

So this gets weirder, but I have to impress upon you how quickly this story moved. I mean it was only a year and a half ago, so maybe you recall it, and I'm not sure how deep into paranormal twitter and Instagram you were at the time, but suffice it to say, if the keywords *Aliens*, *Interdimensional*, *Miami*, and *Police* were in a post in January 2024, that post was likely to show up in my algorithm.

My point is that I live in this area. So not only was this national news, but it's on my local turf. And the second I heard about a commotion drawing 100 cop cars to a Mall in Miami, I instantly heard the stories of a cover up and large unexplainable beings.

It was simultaneous. The first time I heard the story, which was that next day, I heard that the news and the authorities weren't telling the truth about that night, and that it wasn't a fight, and that the reason the police showed up in the hundreds was because some kind of interdimensional shadow creatures were inside the mall and people freaked out.

It's important to remember that the term Aliens was only applied by the media afterwards. And people started describing whatever these things allegedly were as Aliens, for lack of a better word.

We'll get into the really bizarre parts, but first I want to read a headline from CBS News Miami, on January 5th, 2024:

Rumors of 'shadow aliens' at Bayside Marketplace go viral after large fight among teens creates chaos

Ok, What?

Think about that. Why would rumors of shadow aliens go viral after a fight?

When a fight really breaks out at the mall, people say things like...

"It wasn't me,"

"It was a gang,"

"It was kids from Westwood,"

.... Whatever. They don't just say it was shadow aliens out of the blue.

Kids get in a fight at the mall and everyone there just says it was aliens for no reason? I mean you have to admit, that's crazy, even for Florida.

Now let's get into some of those original claims that set this whole thing off. One of the first things was a Twitter post Made at 5:37 AM on January the 5th 2024, so just four days after the incident. This post got hundreds of thousands of views right away and went on to continually rack up traffic on its way to being legitimately viral. It was posted by a person named Mo, whose account was @moab2597 but as far as I can tell that account has been hijacked by some political leaning sports commentator, I'm really not sure, but whoever's posting on X now under that name does not seem to be the original poster who had so much to say about the Creatures in the Miami mall.

So let's take a trip back in time and read what that OP did have to say. And I'm just gonna read from this series of 3 tweets.

The first one says...

I was at the Miami mall yesterday and the government is lying. There were no kids fighting. Everyone started panicking because these Gray creatures were walking around. They didn't make any noises or sounds but stared and watched you move.

I tried to take a video but every time I would try to, it would just bug out. They set a perimeter and wouldn't let anybody out or in unless they went through their photos. We were visited by aliens and the government is covering it up.

They were about six to seven feet tall and walked very slowly. They could turn their head around completely and it seemed like they could change forms. Like they didn't have any bones and could bend their body in whatever way. No fingers or feet, just arms and legs.

They could also seemingly teleport. They weren't walking around normally but instead disappearing and then quickly reappearing somewhere else. This allowed them to walk through some of the glass displays in the mall and through walls. You couldn't escape if they wanted to kill.

But they didn't seem aggressive nor did they seem like they wanted to kill anybody. It almost seemed like they were lost. But they also weren't scared of the army of police that was all around. They must have felt like they were far superior.

OK so that's it for Mo, and her viral tweet-Xpost-microblog-story-published on the social media botfest called X, the artist formerly known as a blue-bird twitter

political echochamber for the left and now an irrelevant toxic time-drain fueled by access media celebs and rightwing warhawk apologists, and her Xpost-tweet was one of the first to get widespread exposure.

So a lot of people who were there that night we're saying that what the police reported as fireworks, were not really fireworks, but were customers in the mall whipping out their own guns and shooting at whatever these 10 foot tall shadow creatures were. People who were there say that's what the riot was about... it was everyone running from these things. Multiple people said there were three of them and they were all walking together. And by many accounts they emerged from these portals walked through the mall kind of ignored everyone but it freaked everybody out because they were 10 foot tall and looked like shadow alien creatures people were shooting at them and it wasn't doing anything and everyone was just kind of running and creating a huge chaotic scene.

I also have to say that every single word in those 3 or 4 tweets from Mo is entirely written with the caps locks on, so there's that.

So in those Twitter posts that person also tells us that power was shut down for several blocks around the mall that night, that all the police radio traffic on the scanners went dead at the same time, and that black helicopters without lights we're flying over the mall that night.

Now the whole thing about the power being off in that area is true. I found a report from FPL which is the Florida power light company in that area, which tells us how many households were out of power at the time. Not only that a lot of witnesses in the area made this observation that while the police descended upon the mall that power was cut off in the surrounding blocks.

In addition to that a lot of people reported seeing these unmarked black helicopters flying over the mall.

And there's some debate online as to whether or not police radio traffic went silent. Some people say that the police turned the scanners off, which anyone saying that doesn't understand how a police scanner works. And whether or not the radio traffic was accessible or not is something that's really hard to prove in hindsight. But either way it's just another fishy component of this story.

Another thing that I can't overstate is the sheer astounding police response to this situation. I know I've said it before and you can see the pictures in the dark Intel files on Patreon if you want but it's amazing how many policemen were there. I've seen interviews online with people who live in the area saying things like I've never seen that many police for anything or any reason, and I grew up here and have lived in Miami for 40 years period so things like that, I mean, that's saying something.

I used to live in South Florida and while I was down there if you *didn't* hear a police siren for 10-seconds, it got your attention.

Another thing that we hear about over and over is that air traffic over the mall was locked down, and that takeoffs and landings at the nearby airport were frozen and delayed during this whole incident. Why would you do that for four kids fighting in the mall? None of this makes any sense.

There is also another facet to this case that very much deserves a mention. In the days that followed the event, many observed that this could have been a psyop to distract the public from the initial supposed release of the Epstein Client List.

The release of Epstein's list had been in the news at the time and it was supposed to go public just a few days after this Miami Mall fiasco. Alert and aware people saw this big, unexplainable, public display that had generated unexplained viral posts about aliens that were now being covered by the mainstream as an obvious false flag set up as a public distraction from the Epstein thing. It's quite possible, and I'd never put it past them, but if this is a false flag distraction from the Epstein Client List, then it's a pretty extensive and elaborate one.

(Epstein didn't kill himself.)

...

In addition to the videos showing hundreds of police cars there are a few videos from inside the mall, and from the testimony of most of the people that were there who were saying that something weird was going on, *the inside* of the shopping center was where the action took place.

There's one video that shows this glowing ball type of a portal open up. People around it seemed to be startled they fall over off of benches they run out of the way a couple people are filming it and moving closer and it looks like a ball of light that's about the size of, ohh I don't know, about the size of a washer or a dryer if that appliance was a globe.

It undulates and sort of moves in and out of form and then it vanishes and one guy walks up to the spot where it was and sort of searches around there's nothing there period now that video has been shared and re shared and sent around the Internet so much that I wasn't able to find the original poster of it. It doesn't really matter. By all accounts it is footage from the inside of the mall but there's no way to know if it's real or fake or animated or CGI or anything it's impossible to tell it's grainy it's gnarly looking and the people's reactions to it look like they're reacting to something but it's just impossible to know exactly what's going on in that video.

This brings up a really good point, which is that, even though this was only a year and a half ago, at the time there was at least some debate to be made about whether this or that video was real footage or not. Since then advances in AI are so staggering that, unfortunately, that argument has utterly become a moot point.

We are there already where arguments about whether a video is real or not, have become like arguments in the Victorian era over whether a horse drawn carriage is better than the new steam-powered motor-coach.

But in this story we have videos that we know came out at the time, and some of them may be real and some of them may be creative productions, but at least we can still have a chat about it, and videos that are from that night are still part of the evidence that we have, as we look into this event.

One of those videos shows what people say is a creature coming out of this doorway looking portal. Now I've watched this video many, many times and I do see what they're talking about, but it's very far to the right edge of the screen. It's barely captured in frame. The whole thing is super low resolution and blurry. And whatever this thing is that they're calling a creature only appears in the last split second of that video. So once again this is something that is inconclusive. It could be something, but there is absolutely no way to know.

Searching through and for videos like this is what led me down an extremely deep rabbit hole, and I ended up finding this story about a group known as Above and Below.

So according to one customer who says he was there, And I never found out his name, but he seemed like a legitimate honest person. He was a grown man, I'd say 40 years old would be my guess, and he came across as an honest guy telling a matter of fact story, albeit A fantastical one, and he seemed just as surprised about the whole thing as anyone.

So what this guy says is that he was in the Bayside marketplace mall that night, and he was sitting on one of the benches near a planter along one of the main corridors that run between the retail stores there.

I guess he was waiting for his girlfriend who was in one of the stores.

So while he's sitting there minding his own business he sees three guys come up and sit on one of the benches that's maybe 15 or 20 feet away from where he was. One of them takes off his backpack and pulls out some piece of electronic equipment that he initially thought was probably some kind of video gaming console.

At first he didn't think much of it, and it sort of crossed his mind that they were probably bringing whatever this thing was to one of the stores to see if they could either get it worked on, or maybe it was a really old one, possibly worth some money and maybe they were going to try to sell it.

So a few minutes go by and he realizes that these kids have also pulled an electrical cord out of their bag, they've been fiddling with this machine the whole time, whatever it is. And he realizes that they're having this debate, or a little bit of a discussion amongst themselves, as to whether or not they should plug it in.

So where these three younger guys are sitting, this man who tells the story says he thinks they were in their early 20s, so anyway where these guys are fiddling with this device is sort of a concrete bench that goes around a concrete planter it's in the shape of a rectangle inside the planter and above the back of what would be the bench there's an area where there's, ferns and foliage plants, and in the center of the planter there's a column that sticks up about 3 feet above the plants.

It's maybe 4 inches in diameter it has a light on top of it and apparently somewhere on that column is an electrical outlet.

So the guy telling us this story says that in hindsight he realized that the kids probably knew there was an electrical outlet there already. He thinks that's why they chose that spot.

So he watches the guys debate for a minute or so, and at some point they all seem to agree, and they're like... "yeah let's do this."

So they put the box on the bench, two of the guys stand up and back up a little ways, and the third guy gets up on his knees on the bench seat leans across the ferns and plugs the box in.

He grabs the empty backpack and takes a few steps away to join his two friends we're together they stand there looking at the box.

At this point the man telling us the story realizes that this might be one of those situations where the best thing to do would be to get out of there. He has no idea what this box is, he doesn't know what these guys are up to, but he gets that feeling that he'd rather not stick around to find out. So he gets up from the bench starts to walk away from the scene, crosses the open hallway, and climbs up the stairs to the landing on the other side which crosses in front of the store where his girlfriend is. He's gonna walk by and grab her and tell her, come on it's time to get out of here.

As he's walking along that second story landing toward the store, he hears some electrical humming, turns back, and from that higher vantage point looking down

upon the bench where the box is, he sees multi colored lights swirling around the thing it's buzzing and popping and crackling, the three kids who had plugged it in don't seem to be anywhere around, and then the box makes a popping sound, is suddenly surrounded by what he described as a black void, he grabs a door handle to the store where he thinks his girlfriend is, looks back down one more time here's people screaming, and sees what he describes as 10 foot tall shadow creatures walking in slow motion.

The guy collects his girlfriend and they run for it with everyone else.

They have to go back down the stairs to get outside, and at the bottom of those stairs on the other end of that breezeway, he sees the three guys just standing there, and watching everybody run like maniacs.

He doesn't really want to confront them but he can't help himself, and as he's walking by he just says to them, "who are you guys?"

The guy in the middle, the one with the empty backpack, says to him, "Above and Below."

The man asked, "What's that?" and the same guy answered, "Realm Hackers."

So this guy and his girl make it out of there no problem. But the entire scene is chaos and everyone is freaking out. They find their car they deal with the traffic and eventually make their way home.

Right away, as soon as he gets home, he goes online and starts doing research trying to find anything he can about the realm hackers. This guy is some kind of engineer, so he knows his way around a computer, and the whole thing leads him to some nefarious corners of the Internet and what he learns is that the realm hackers are some shadowy socio-anarchist group whose mission it is to open portals to other dimensions, in public places.

For what reason I have no idea. And according to this guy who's telling us this story, since then, all of the information he found initially on that first night, concerning the realm hackers, has been either scrubbed entirely, or moved into even sketchier corners of the dark web.

There is one video made by a guy called Richard Bruce on Rumble, and he does a good job of explaining what Above and Below is, and what they do and why. Also a bit about how. So I'm going to give Richard credit with a link in the show notes to his Rumble Video.

But in that video when Richard describes the equipment these guys use, it seems a lot more involved than the basic video gaming console thing that our anonymous friend described seeing these kids plug in.

There is also a pretty good Instagram post by someone called DTOXART in Texas, and between the RB Video and this Insta post comes the bulk of what I could find on the Realm Hackers.

Just to paraphrase the information both of these sources give us, we learn that a group called Above and Below, who say they are realm hackers, use some device to open lower-dimension portals in public places just for the fun of it, I don't know it's kind of crazy.

Opening a lower-dimension portal is a new type of event called "rifting" since the device used to tune into and rip open these dimensions is called an RFT box.

An RFT box is a modified Radio Frequency Tuner made in the 80s combined with a household kitchen pressure cooker that has been, quote, "brutally modified with a copper wrapped obsidian core that floats in red mercury (a substance readily available on the dark web)." (endquote)

This device is then electrically charged under pressure and it creates a distortion in time space called a *Swell*. The swell is cut with a concentrated radio wave produced by the RFT box and this causes a Tear between the dimensions.

In other words, it makes a temporary doorway.

Most entities that can navigate through these makeshift portals are considered corrupted energy leeches, which seem to be some kind of succubus-class Demogorg who are subservient to the hi-ranking interdimensional creatures who, in some ill-defined way, manage them.

The group of teens that opened the first dimensional doorway in Bayside Mall in Miami said, quote, "we knew we wanted a high concentration of people that feed off of dopamine to experience the event, since these creatures feed off of fear and terror to gain new strength levels and abilities. We needed to expose them to as many souls in a confined space as we could, and a shopping mall was the perfect place." (endquote)

These Interdimensional creatures aren't really physically violent as much as they are hungry and curious. Almost looking famished and lost. Bumbling around and randomly flailing as they glitch in and out of our reality due to energy loss.

They must consume to stay here. So the more people that look at them in fear, the stronger they get. They actually have faces but choose to hide them as this method induces a more concentrated spike of initial terror in all who witness them.

Note: Most law enforcement have already been trained in this Corrupted Energy Leech Logistics protocol known as C.E.L.L.

We're also are told that the CELL protocol is a method where a huge swarm of law enforcement officers use multiple sound generators to make directed sound streams that irritate the creatures and in this way they can make them walk in the directions they want them to, and I guess drive them back out through the portals, or diminish their energy to the point that they glitch out and vanish.

So that's it for the info in that video and insta post, basically, and I'm just telling you what I've learned here.

The information does align with Mos claim that the creatures looked lost. And it does line up with the hundreds of police officers we know were on the scene.

But if every law enforcement officer was trained in corralling shadow beings back into lower dimensions using sound guns, I'd like to think we would know about it, but who knows at this point.

As far as information on the realm hacking group Above and Below, this is basically all I've been able to find out. If I knew exactly what I was looking for I might be able to dig through the wayback machine and find more information, but most of what I've found (and just as importantly have not found) suggests that whomever and whatever this group is, it appears that they've gone pretty dark.

One thing I want to mention from this whole realm hacker angle, is this recurring notion that part of what these guys are up to involves making this device that uses red mercury as one of its components period now if you go online the top searches you'll find are a bunch of articles, and a Wikipedia page, all telling you that red mercury is fiction, that it doesn't exist, and it's basically people making stuff up.

But at the same time, you can find tons of information on a substance called mercury sulfide, which is a solid mineral, is bright red, and is actually one of the main sources of deriving everyday common silver liquid mercury.

So I'm always skeptical when I see situations like this, where mainstream information sources like Wikipedia talk out of both sides of their mouth. On one page telling you red mercury doesn't exist, and on another page telling you all about mercury sulfide which is a red form of solid mercury.

Another theory about what was going on at the Miami mall that night, is this sort of biblical return of the Nephilim. You can find many videos where people are debating and espousing this theory but the basics of it are that the Bible tells us that these fallen angels mated with humankind to produce these giant, superhuman beings Called the Nephilim, and that these 10 foot tall shadowy

monsters that were seen in the Miami mall are the return of these biblical monsters.

This is a very strange story with a lot of INS and outs. And there's one more thing that I want to touch on and this is something I thought of independently, and it may be an idea that others have had as well, and it's not terribly involved it's just an observation.

So here it is and it has to do with a sort of predictive programming. So in the Miami mall incident, the police and the media tell us that teenagers started a fight and were shooting off fireworks. Hundreds of police men and at least 100 police cars showed up and arrested a grand total of four kids. And right away social media lit up saying no had nothing to do with the fight, there were these giant interdimensional shadow alien creatures moving in and out of existence and that's what everyone was running from.

Now that's a bizarre story to say the least because it's just such an unlikely weird thing for people to make up. And yeah I know people make up stuff about aliens and UFO's all the time but inside a mall it's just weird.

So this is something I thought of while I was working on the episode and it has to do once again would the TV series stranger things. Stranger things seems to be coming up a lot lately which is kind of odd, but not terribly out of the ordinary considering the subject matter that we tackle here on renegade files.

But while I was working on this episode I remembered something and I can't help but think of it as paralleling this story to the point of predictive programming. It was stranger things season 3 I think, where a giant creature from another realm comes into this world through a portal underneath a shopping mall. The government tries to cover it up, a bunch of teenagers get mixed up in the whole thing, and this giant interdimensional creature descends on the kids in the shopping mall, and what did the kids fight the creature with? ... Fireworks.

So don't you think it's just a little ironic that years before we have a season of stranger things where teenagers in a mall fight a giant interdimensional being using fireworks, And then a few years later we have this thing at the Miami mall, were the police and the media tell us a bunch of kids were fighting with fireworks, but the people who were there tell us on social media there was actually giant interdimensional alien shadow beings walking through the mall and that's what caused the chaos.

At this point it's redundant to say that there's something weird going on here. This is one of those cases where people using their common sense and simple abilities of observation didn't believe the official story right off the bat. Even before we heard anyone say anything paranormal, everyone who saw that video from above of all the police cars instantly said that's not for four kids fighting at

the mall. It was obvious. This was an incredible show of force that no one had ever seen before.

I mean think about it, this is something like 20 times the amount of policemen who showed up to Columbine. In this insane level of response doesn't match up with the official reason.

And then the second that the story hits the news, the whole area chimes in with people crying foul.

They're not telling you the truth.

No, no, no, that's not what happened at all.

People were freaking out because there were giant shadowy interdimensional alien creatures that exited a portal and walked through the mall.

We were watching them phase in and out of form.

Gangster kids in the mall were shooting at them as everyone ran for their lives and the cops must have known something about these creatures, because that's why so many of them showed up.

These were the common stories of the average people coming out of the place that night.

They said the police were stopping, not because of anybody fighting in the mall, but to make them delete their videos and photos from their phones before they were allowed to freely leave.

And stories like that just drive home the point that I was making earlier, which is you're not going to tell me that in this day and age a bunch of teenagers are fighting in a mall in Miami, and no other teenagers are filming it. That's just not gonna happen. And even if the police made them delete the videos of the fight, which seems like a weird thing to do under the circumstances, then those videos would surely start to surface a day or two later.

Even if you delete a photo or a video off of your phone you have like a month that you can go back into the deleted files and get access to it again. So that whole thing makes me believe that there was no fight.

But then, that begs the question, which is, OK fine there's no footage of a fight because there was no fight, but then where is the late in the game surfacing video footage of these giant aliens.

Now, arguably there is some, but The so-called videos of these Miami mall creatures make those old-school, Blurry Pictures, of Bigfoot look like 4K cinema. So where is the clear footage of one of these things?

Our hero Mo tells us that she tried to get pictures and videos of the things, and every time she did her phone would glitch out. I would love to see something definitive, and if anyone has anything leave a link to it in a comment on our latest Instagram post, where we are @renegade files on Instagram.

I actually love Instagram as far as social media goes, it's a generally positive community, and I'm a very visual person so I like the platform. I post stuff there periodically. So yeah, these Miami mall stories are crazy but when you dig into what you can find under the surface here, the stories just get weirder and weirder.

This is probably one of those things that you could spend an enormous amount of time researching and digging into. I had a lot of fun doing that for this episode, and I hope you enjoyed listening to it. As far as what I could find, that's gonna wrap it up.
