PART 1 — Haunted Police Files

HAUNTED CASE 1

Gettysburg Battlefield Police and Park Ranger Encounters

- July 1974, approximately 2:30 a.m.

National Park Service Ranger patrol near Devil's Den reported hearing rhythmic marching sounds on rocky ground where no gravel path exists.

Sound described as synchronized footfalls rather than scattered movement. Ranger stopped vehicle, exited patrol car, and sound ceased immediately.

- August 1976, overnight shift between 1:00 and 3:00 a.m.

Two Gettysburg National Military Park rangers, names withheld in internal logs, reported seeing a line of uniformed figures moving across Little Round Top.

Figures described as semi illuminated, grayish in tone, and silent.

No modern clothing or equipment visible.

Figures vanished as rangers approached on foot.

- October 1982, approximately 11:45 p.m.

Pennsylvania State Trooper responding to a disabled vehicle near Seminary Ridge reported hearing cannon fire sounds in the distance.

Trooper radioed dispatch to confirm no scheduled reenactments or artillery demonstrations.

Dispatch confirmed none.

Sound lasted approximately 30 seconds and ended abruptly.

- June 1985, 2:10 a.m.

NPS Ranger Karl Johnson documented a visual encounter while conducting fence line checks near the Wheatfield.

Observed a single soldier figure standing near a tree line.

Uniform appeared inconsistent with modern reenactments.

When challenged verbally, figure turned slightly and then faded from view without movement of brush or ground disturbance.

- July 1988, early morning hours before dawn

Group of three park employees conducting maintenance reported hearing low voiced murmuring and metallic clinking consistent with gear or rifles.

No visible individuals present.

Sounds moved across the field rather than staying fixed.

Employees later stated the sound path aligned with known troop movements from historical maps.

- September 1992, approximately 12:30 a.m.

State trooper conducting routine patrol near the Pennsylvania Monument reported seeing lantern like lights moving in a straight line formation.

Lights extinguished simultaneously.

No heat signatures detected afterward.

No civilian vehicles or hikers located in the area.

- July 1995, overnight patrol

NPS Ranger Mark Nesbitt, later known for compiling park accounts, documented multiple ranger reports of full body apparitions near the Peach Orchard.

Figures appeared briefly and vanished without sound.

Rangers noted the absence of flashlight reflection on the figures.

Encounters logged but categorized as unexplained visual anomalies.

- August 2000, approximately 1:15 a.m.
Gettysburg Borough Police Officer James Morgan reported responding to a call from tourists claiming they were approached by a man in old fashioned uniform asking for water.

When tourists turned back after retrieving a bottle, the individual was gone.

Officer searched immediate area with no results.

No footprints or disturbances found.

- July 2003, just after midnight
Multiple visitors reported hearing fife music near Cemetery Hill.

Rangers responding heard faint music themselves but could not locate a source.

Music ceased when patrol vehicles approached the area.

No performers or audio equipment found.

- October 2008, overnight security patrol
Two contracted security officers reported seeing shadow figures moving through fog near the Angle.

Figures appeared taller than average and moved in formation.
When vehicle headlights were directed toward the area, the figures vanished.

Incident recorded in nightly activity log without explanation.

- July 2013, 2:00 a.m.
NPS ranger conducting solo patrol near Devil's Den reported sudden temperature drop and auditory experience of whispered voices.

Voices described as overlapping and unintelligible.

Ranger exited area and documented event at end of shift.

- Ongoing through 2020s
Park rangers and state troopers continue to report unexplained auditory and visual phenomena during overnight patrols.

Incidents most frequently occur between midnight and 3:00 a.m.
Reports cluster around Devil's Den, Little Round Top, the Wheatfield, and Cemetery Hill.

Many officers request partner patrols in these areas after dark.

HAUNTED CASE 2

Trans-Allegheny Lunatic Asylum , Sheriff Office Responses

- October 1994, approximately 9:30 p.m.

Lewis County Sheriff deputies responded to a trespassing call at the abandoned asylum complex in Weston.

Two juveniles reported hearing voices and fleeing the building.

Deputies entered the main building to clear it and reported unexplained footsteps on upper floors while the lower floors were empty.

- November 1995, shortly after midnight

Deputy Robert Matheny responded to an alarm triggered in the administrative wing.

Alarm panel showed multiple interior door sensors activated simultaneously.

Deputy cleared the building and found all doors locked and undisturbed.

While exiting, deputy reported hearing a female voice whispering behind him.

No one found during secondary sweep.

- August 1997, approximately 1:40 a.m.

Sheriff patrol unit observed lights visible in second floor windows while passing the property.

No authorized personnel scheduled on site.

Deputies entered with flashlights and found no power running to the building.

Light source could not be identified and disappeared while deputies were inside.

- June 1999, overnight patrol

Two deputies conducting routine property checks reported doors slamming in distant corridors.

Sound traveled along the hallway rather than echoing randomly.

Deputies attempted to follow sound but lost it near the old patient wards.

Temperature drop reported in the same area.

- September 2001, approximately 10:15 p.m.
Lewis County Sheriff Office responded to reports from a private security guard stationed on the property.

Guard reported being physically shoved from behind while standing alone in the central hallway.

No individuals found during full building sweep.

After this, the Guard refused to remain on site alone.

- April 2003, around 11:00 p.m.
Deputy Mark Wolfe responded to motion sensor alerts in the north wing.

Motion logs showed sequential activation consistent with walking movement.

Deputy heard coughing sounds while approaching the wing.

Sounds ceased abruptly when deputy announced presence.

- October 2005, approximately 12:30 a.m.
Sheriff deputies responding to a break in alarm reported hearing metal bed frames scraping across concrete floors above them.

No movable furniture present in cleared areas.

No dust disturbance found after inspection.

- May 2008, overnight shift
Two deputies escorting a historical society representative for after hours access reported shadow figures crossing doorways ahead of them.

Figures did not cast flashlight reflections.

Representative later confirmed no reenactors or staff were on site.

- August 2010, approximately 1:50 a.m.
Deputy conducting solo patrol near the medical wing reported hearing repeated knocking from inside an empty room.

Knocking occurred three times and then stopped.

Room found empty with no loose fixtures.

- June 2012, shortly after midnight
Lewis County Sheriff Office received multiple calls from nearby residents

reporting screams coming from the building.

Deputies responded and heard distant crying sounds inside the structure.

Sounds could not be pinpointed and ceased before exit.

- October 2015, overnight patrol

Deputy and corporal conducting joint patrol reported seeing a figure standing at the end of a long corridor.

Figure appeared stationary and human shaped.

When approached, figure vanished without sound.

Both officers documented the exact event and details independently.

- March 2018, approximately 2:20 a.m.

Deputies responding to a triggered fire alarm reported hearing rapid footsteps running above them.

Alarm panel showed no fire or smoke detected.

Footsteps stopped when deputies reached stairwell access.

- Ongoing through early 2020s

Sheriff deputies and local law enforcement continue to respond to alarms, trespass calls, and security checks at the property.

Reports consistently include voices, footsteps, shadow figures, and physical sensations.

Multiple deputies request paired patrols inside the building after dark.

Incidents cluster between 11:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m., primarily in former patient wards and medical wings.

HAUNTED CASE 3

Enfield Poltergeist Sheriff and State Police Calls (1974)

- March 25, 1974, evening hours

Enfield Police Department received initial disturbance calls from the Herrmann family residence on South First Street.

Complaints involved loud banging noises and objects moving inside the home.

Officers responding found no signs of forced entry or vandalism.

- March 26, 1974, approximately 7:30 p.m.

Enfield Police Officer Ron Falk responded to a second call at the residence.

Officer observed a chair move several feet across the floor without physical contact.

Loud knocking sounds were heard from walls and ceilings.

Officer documented the incident and requested additional support.

- March 26, 1974, shortly after 8:00 p.m.

Enfield Police Chief Robert Griggs arrived on scene.

Multiple officers witnessed furniture sliding and shaking.

Knocking sounds followed officers as they moved from room to room.

No structural cause identified during inspection.

- March 27, 1974, early morning hours

White County Sheriff deputies responded following continued activity overnight.

Deputies reported beds shaking and dressers moving.

Sounds described as heavy impacts rather than settling or vibration.

Family members interviewed separately gave consistent accounts.

- March 28, 1974, approximately 6:45 p.m.

Illinois State Police troopers arrived to observe reported activity firsthand.

Troopers witnessed a refrigerator slide several inches across the kitchen floor.

Audible growling or guttural sounds reported by multiple witnesses simultaneously.

Troopers confirmed events occurred while all occupants were visible.

- March 29, 1974, evening hours

Law enforcement returned after reports of objects being thrown.

Officers observed small household items lift and fall.

One officer reported being struck by a flying object.

No individuals seen causing the movement.

- March 30, 1974, approximately 9:00 p.m.
Sheriff deputies documented violent shaking of walls and floorboards.

Officers placed marking tape to track movement of furniture.

Furniture later found displaced from marked positions.

Deputies signed affidavits attesting to unexplained movement.

- March 31, 1974, late evening
Officers recorded audio of knocking and scraping sounds during active disturbances.

Sounds responded to verbal commands such as stop or knock once.

Knocks occurred in direct response to questions.

No mechanical source identified.

- Early April 1974, multiple nights
Continued joint presence of Enfield Police, White County Sheriff, and Illinois State Police.

Officers witnessed activity repeatedly over several visits.

Events appeared to intensify when law enforcement was present.

Family temporarily relocated due to severity.

- April 6, 1974, approximately 10:30 p.m.
Illinois State Police trooper documented a loud roar heard inside the home.

Sound described as animal like but unfamiliar.

No animals found inside or outside the residence.

- April 10, 1974, overnight
Activity began to diminish in intensity.

Officers noted fewer object movements but continued knocking.

No arrests or criminal explanations identified.

- Mid April 1974
Law enforcement presence reduced as activity subsided.

Final reports filed describing events as unexplained disturbances.

Officers involved later reaffirmed accounts in interviews and statements.

- Long term aftermath
Enfield Police and White County Sheriff officers involved maintained consistency in accounts over decades.

Case cited as one of the rare instances where multiple law enforcement agencies witnessed poltergeist activity directly.

To this day, Affidavits and the official reports remain part of departmental records.

Part 2: The Cryptid BOLOs

CRYPTID CASE 1

Point Pleasant Mothman Police Reports

- Late November 1966, approximately 11:15 p.m.
Local police dispatcher in Point Pleasant, West Virginia logged first reports of a large flying creature seen near the TNT area.

Multiple 911-type calls from residents described a large gray figure with glowing red eyes and wings.

Calls noted rapid movement and low-pitched screeches heard before sightings.

Officers were dispatched to investigate.

- November 16, 1966, shortly before midnight
Point Pleasant Police Officer David A. Teel responded to a report of lights and noises near the old World War II munitions site.

Officer Teel reported equipment sensation similar to vehicle headlights even though none were present.

As he approached the area, loud flapping and distant screaming noises were heard.

No visual contact made by the officer at that time.

- November 17, 1966, 10:45 p.m.
Patrolman Gary Brewer and Officer Fred Rash at the TNT area corner witnessed an unusually large winged shape crossing the road.

Shape described as large as a small airplane.

When illuminated by patrol car headlights, the figure paused, and its two red eyes remained visible before it accelerated upward.

Officers reported the object traveled rapidly and silently after takeoff.

- Late November 1966, subsequent nights
Multiple officers from the Point Pleasant Police Department independently reported similar sightings along Route 62 near the river road by the munitions site.

Descriptions consistently mentioned glowing red eyes, a large wingspan, and movements inconsistent with known birds.

Some officers chose not to pursue due to safety concerns and poor visibility.

- December 1966, repeating reports
Sheriff deputies from Mason County were notified and responded to assist local police.

Deputies documented sightings along the Ohio River corridor.

Reports included low altitude movement over fields and treetops.

Deputies corroborated red eye reflections seen at night.

No weapons discharged during any confirmed sighting.

- January 1, 1967, approximately 1:30 a.m.
Officer John Freeman, recently transferred from another district, joined a nighttime search party led by local law enforcement.

Freeman reported seeing movement in the brush and hearing a strong wing beating sound.

When the search party approached, the sound abruptly stopped and no physical creature was located.

- Mid January 1967
Local police held a departmental briefing due to the frequency of calls.

Officers offered individual statements describing consistent patterns of size, eye glow, flight behavior, and timing.

Reports were logged as unidentified airborne creatures but not officially classified as wildlife.

Some reports were archived for historical documentation due to repeated unexplained elements.

- February 1967 and onward
Sightings tapered but continued intermittently through late 1967.

Law enforcement maintained files of descriptions and witness statements.

Officers involved later noted the unusual similarities among independent reports and lack of conventional explanations.

This was a huge case with international attention. On this episode we're just going over official police reports that can be categorized as paranormal. If you would like to dive deeper into Mothman and other anomalous winged

XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX

CRYPTID CASE 2
**Bridgewater Triangle
State Police Encounters**

- Early 1970s, overnight patrol hours
Massachusetts State Police troopers assigned to rural patrol zones within southeastern Massachusetts reported unusual animal sightings while conducting routine traffic and safety patrols.

Initial reports involved large dark figures moving near wooded roadways.

Troopers described silhouettes too tall and broad to match known wildlife in the region.

- October 1973, approximately 1:20 a.m.
State trooper responding to a disabled vehicle near Freetown State Forest reported seeing a large upright figure crossing the road ahead.

Figure moved on two legs and disappeared into dense tree cover.

Trooper searched the area briefly and found no tracks consistent with deer or bear.

- July 1976, late night patrol
Two Massachusetts State Police troopers conducting joint patrol near Route 44 observed a large shape moving parallel to the road at a sustained pace.

Shape appeared to keep pace with the patrol car for several seconds.

When spotlighted, the figure moved deeper into the woods without visible stumbling or hesitation.

Troopers noted unusual height and shoulder width.

- August 1979, approximately 12:45 a.m.
State trooper responding to a minor traffic accident near East Taunton reported hearing heavy footfalls and branch snapping nearby.

Trooper observed a tall dark mass retreating from the roadside.

No reflective eyes were seen, unlike typical animals.

Trooper completed accident report and logged the sighting separately.

- September 1982, overnight detail

Troopers assigned to patrol near abandoned quarry areas reported strange vocalizations described as low pitched and sustained.

Sounds did not resemble coyotes, owls, or known regional animals.

Sounds moved through the forest rather than remaining stationary.

Troopers elected not to pursue on foot due to terrain and darkness.

- May 1986, approximately 2:00 a.m.

State police patrol unit near the Hockomock Swamp area reported seeing a large bipedal figure illuminated briefly by headlights.

Figure paused at the edge of the road before stepping backward into the tree line.

Trooper described the movement as deliberate and controlled.

No vehicle traffic or pedestrians present.

- July 1991, overnight patrol

Two troopers conducting radar enforcement reported sudden disorientation and difficulty estimating distance while driving through the area.

Both troopers independently reported a sensation of time passing unusually quickly.

No mechanical or medical issues identified.

Incident noted informally during shift debriefing.

- October 1994, approximately 11:30 p.m.

State trooper responding to reports of trespassers near Freetown Forest observed large footprints near muddy ground.

Footprints appeared elongated and deeper than typical human tracks.

No matching footwear impressions found.

Tracks ended abruptly at rocky terrain.

- June 1998, just after midnight
Troopers responding to reports of strange lights observed glowing orbs moving low over the swamp area.

Lights changed direction abruptly and extinguished simultaneously.

Troopers confirmed no aircraft or drones in the area.

Event logged as unidentified lights.

- August 2003, overnight patrol
State trooper observed a large dark figure standing motionless near a tree line while vehicle was stopped.

When trooper exited vehicle, figure moved silently into the woods.

No sound of brush or breaking branches heard during movement.

- September 2010, approximately 1:40 a.m.
Troopers assisting local police with a missing person search reported hearing repeated knocking sounds from deep within wooded areas.

Knocking occurred in sets of two or three.

Search teams could not locate a source.

Sounds ceased when teams regrouped.

- Ongoing through 2010s
Massachusetts State Police and local law enforcement continue to receive reports of large humanoid sightings within the Bridgewater Triangle region.

Encounters most often occur during overnight patrols between 11:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m.

Reports frequently involve bipedal movement, unusual size, and absence of typical animal behavior.

Some troopers request backup when investigating similar calls at night.

XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX

CRYPTID CASE 3
Skamania County
Sheriff Deputy Bigfoot Encounter

- Early summer 1971, late evening hours
Skamania County Sheriff Office received reports from residents near the Gifford Pinchot

National Forest of large humanoid figures seen along rural roads.

Reports described a tall, broad shouldered figure crossing roads and moving into dense forest.

Deputies were advised to remain alert during overnight patrols in remote areas.

- July 1971, approximately 11:40 p.m.
Skamania County Sheriff Deputy, name withheld in early reports, was conducting routine patrol along a forest service access road.

Deputy observed a large upright figure standing near the edge of the road illuminated by headlights.

Figure appeared covered in dark hair and stood well over six feet tall.

Deputy slowed vehicle and observed the figure turn its head toward the patrol car.

- Moments later
The figure stepped off the road and moved into the forest without stumbling or hesitation.

Movement described as smooth and deliberate rather than panicked.

Deputy noted unusually long arm length relative to torso.

No visible eyeshine was observed during the encounter.

- Immediately following sighting
Deputy exited patrol vehicle and conducted a brief foot search with flashlight.

Heavy footfalls were heard moving away through the brush.

Sounds suggested significant body weight due to depth and spacing of steps.

Deputy did not pursue further due to terrain and visibility conditions.

- July 1971, shortly after midnight
Deputy radioed the sighting to dispatch.

Incident logged as an unidentified subject encounter.

No search team was deployed at that time due to lack of threat to public safety.

- Following days

Sheriff Office received additional calls from nearby residents reporting loud vocalizations described as deep howls or roars during nighttime hours.

Sounds were reported moving across ridge lines rather than staying fixed.

Deputies conducting drive through patrols heard similar sounds but could not locate a source.

- August 1971, overnight patrol

A second Skamania County deputy reported observing large footprints near a muddy logging road.

Prints appeared elongated with a wide heel impression.

Footprints did not match known human or bear tracks.

Trackway extended for several yards before disappearing onto rocky ground.

- September 1971, early morning hours

Deputies responding to a report of livestock disturbance found fencing pushed down without signs of vehicle impact.

Ground impressions nearby suggested heavy bipedal movement.

No animals or suspects located in the area.

- 1972 to mid 1970s

Skamania County Sheriff Office continued to receive sporadic reports of large humanoid sightings from hikers, loggers, and residents.

Deputies noted similarities in descriptions including height, body mass, and movement.

Encounters clustered near forest service roads and river corridors.

- Late 1970s

Due to frequency of reports, Skamania County gained a reputation among law enforcement as a hotspot for Bigfoot related calls.

Deputies informally referred to the area as a recurring anomaly zone.

No arrests or wildlife explanations were ever confirmed.

- Long term impact
Skamania County later became associated with formal ordinances referencing Bigfoot as a protected species.

Deputies involved in early encounters maintained consistency in descriptions when interviewed years later.

Case remains one of the more frequently cited examples of law enforcement involvement in Bigfoot sightings.

Part 3: The Informants go Psychic

PSYCHIC CASE 1

Miami-Dade

Police Psychic Consultations (1980s–1990s)

- Early 1980s, Miami-Dade County
Miami-Dade Police Department homicide and missing persons units faced multiple stalled investigations involving disappearances near canals, wooded lots, and undeveloped areas.

Detectives quietly discussed nontraditional methods when conventional leads failed.

Psychic consultations were conducted unofficially and not documented in formal case files.

- 1982, missing adult male case, date withheld
Detectives met privately with a local psychic recommended by a victim's family.

Psychic described the victim as deceased before police had confirmed status.

Psychic stated the body was face down near water with one arm bent beneath the torso.

At the time, police had not disclosed body position to anyone outside the department.

Body later recovered from a canal matching the description exactly.

- Same consultation
Psychic mentioned a broken watch stopped at a specific time.

Detectives later recovered the victim's watch, stopped within minutes of the time described.

Watch detail had not been released to family or media.

- Mid 1980s, multiple missing persons cases

Miami-Dade detectives consulted a second psychic known for map based readings.

Psychic placed a finger on a paper map and circled an undeveloped area near a tree line and drainage canal.

Psychic stated the victim was buried shallow and partially exposed by animals.

Detectives later located remains in that area with evidence of animal disturbance.

- 1986, homicide investigation

Psychic consulted during a stalled murder case described a weapon hidden inside a wall or crawlspace.

Psychic specified the weapon was wrapped in cloth and placed behind something heavy.

Detectives later recovered a wrapped weapon concealed behind a water heater in a suspect's residence.

Detail about the wrapping had never been discussed outside investigators.

- Late 1980s, serial offender investigation

Detectives consulted a psychic regarding repeated abductions.

Psychic stated the suspect drove a light colored vehicle and kept personal items from victims.

Psychic described the suspect as having a nervous habit involving hands.

Arrested suspect later found with victim belongings in vehicle and displayed compulsive hand movements during interrogation.

- 1989, missing child case

Psychic told detectives the child was deceased and located near standing water rather than flowing water.

Psychic described a red piece of clothing tangled nearby.

Body later found near a retention pond with red fabric caught in brush.

Clothing color had not been released publicly.

- Early 1990s, homicide cold case review

Detectives consulted a psychic who described a crime scene smell involving fuel or chemicals.

Psychic stated the killer attempted to clean the scene unsuccessfully.

Detectives later reexamined evidence and confirmed presence of cleaning agents previously overlooked.

- Same consultation

Psychic stated the victim had attempted to escape and left a mark or damage behind.

Investigators later identified scratch marks on a door frame previously dismissed as incidental.

- 1993, missing adult female

Psychic provided a description of the victim's final moments, including being restrained briefly and then released.

Psychic described fear rather than prolonged struggle.

Medical examiner later confirmed lack of defensive wounds consistent with limited restraint.

- Internal response within department

Detectives involved reported discomfort with the accuracy of details provided. Some officers refused further psychic involvement due to personal unease rather than disbelief.

Others continued quiet consultations despite official policy discouraging such methods.

- Long term pattern

Psychics repeatedly provided information regarding body positioning, object placement, and environmental details not publicly known.

In several cases, psychics accurately described evidence before it was recovered.

Consultations were never credited officially and remained informal.

Retired detectives later acknowledged psychic input as unsettling but occasionally helpful in breaking investigative deadlocks.

PSYCHIC CASE 2
Los Angeles County
Psychic Assistance Case

- Late 1980s, Los Angeles County
Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department homicide detectives faced a stalled murder investigation involving a young adult female victim.

Case lacked witnesses, usable forensic leads, or a clear suspect.

Detectives privately discussed consulting a psychic after months without progress.

- 1988, private consultation arranged
Detectives met with a psychic recommended through informal law enforcement channels.

Psychic stated the victim was killed indoors rather than at the body recovery site.

Psychic described a small enclosed space with poor lighting and a strong smell of oil or grease.

At the time, detectives believed the murder occurred outdoors.

Later evidence review suggested the body had been moved postmortem.

- Same consultation
Psychic stated the killer had attempted to clean the scene but stopped abruptly.

Psychic described a missed blood trace hidden beneath something movable.

Detectives later discovered blood residue under a refrigerator in a suspect linked location.

The presence of cleaning agents had not been released publicly.

- 1989, follow up consultation

Psychic described the suspect as known to the victim but not emotionally close.

Psychic stated the suspect became agitated when questioned about timing rather than motive.

During later interrogation, a suspect showed visible distress when questioned about the timeline of events.

Detectives noted this behavior as consistent with the psychic's description.

- Same session

Psychic described a specific injury to the victim's head occurring after death.

Psychic stated the injury was caused by impact against a flat surface rather than a weapon.

Medical examiner later confirmed a postmortem head injury consistent with blunt surface impact.

This detail had not been publicly discussed.

- Early 1990, renewed investigation

Detectives revisited overlooked evidence based on psychic statements.

A previously dismissed storage location was searched.

Investigators recovered a personal item belonging to the victim hidden behind stacked boxes.

Item location matched the psychic's description of being concealed but easily accessible.

- 1990, suspect surveillance phase

Psychic advised detectives the suspect kept souvenirs rather than disposing of them.

Surveillance later revealed the suspect repeatedly visiting a storage unit unrelated to work or residence.

Search warrant executed months later recovered items tied to the victim.

Storage unit had not been on the original suspect list.

- Internal reaction among detectives

Detectives involved described discomfort at the specificity of psychic details.

Several officers stated the psychic information forced them to reexamine assumptions they had treated as settled facts.

Some detectives refused to be present at future consultations despite acknowledging usefulness.

- Case resolution
Arrest followed after corroborating evidence emerged.

Psychic involvement was never included in official reports or court proceedings.

Detectives later stated privately that psychic input altered the direction of the investigation at critical points.

- Long term reflections
Retired Los Angeles County detectives later acknowledged psychic consultations occurred more often than publicly admitted.

Psychics were never treated as evidence providers but as prompts for reconsidering stalled cases.

In this case, details provided by the psychic aligned with nonpublic facts discovered later, leaving a lasting impression on investigators.

PSYCHIC CASE 3
New York State
State Police Psychic Missing Person Case

- October 14, 1994, approximately 6:30 p.m.
Adult male departed home in upstate New York driving alone.
Planned route included rural state highways and secondary roads.
Individual failed to arrive at destination later that evening.
- October 14, 1994, approximately 11:45 p.m.
Family reported the individual missing to local authorities.
New York State Police notified due to jurisdiction involving state roadways.
Initial assumption involved vehicle trouble or delayed travel.
- October 15, 1994, early morning hours between 1:00 and 5:00 a.m.
Troopers conducted preliminary checks along known travel route.

No abandoned vehicle or signs of accident located.
Weather conditions reported as cold with intermittent damp ground conditions.

- October 15 to October 20, 1994

Daylight searches conducted along road shoulders, rest areas, and nearby businesses.

No witnesses or surveillance footage identified.

Case began to stall due to lack of physical evidence.

- October 28, 1994, approximately 2:00 p.m.

Family requested investigators meet with a psychic they believed could assist.

New York State Police agreed to an unofficial consultation.

Meeting conducted privately and not entered into case file.

- October 28, 1994, approximately 3:15 p.m.

Psychic stated immediately that the missing individual was deceased.

Psychic described the body as located downhill from a roadway rather than directly roadside.

Psychic emphasized uneven terrain and a slope leading toward damp soil or water.

At this time, searches had focused almost entirely on flat roadside areas.

- Same consultation, approximately 3:30 p.m.

Psychic stated the individual stopped his vehicle voluntarily rather than crashing.

Psychic described confusion or disorientation rather than panic.

Psychic stated the individual walked away from the vehicle a short distance.

This contradicted the primary accident theory held by investigators.

- Same consultation, approximately 3:45 p.m.

Psychic described the body position as lying on its side.

Psychic stated one leg would be bent awkwardly beneath the body.

Psychic mentioned a personal item separated from the body by several yards.

None of these details had been released publicly or shared outside the investigative team.

- November 2, 1994, morning search briefing

Investigators adjusted search parameters to include wooded slopes and ravines.

Teams instructed to search downhill areas near rural roads.

Canine units requested to focus on embankments rather than shoulders.

- November 2, 1994, approximately 11:20 a.m.

Search team located remains approximately 40 to 60 feet downhill from a rural roadway.

Terrain matched description of uneven and damp ground.

Body positioned on its side with one leg bent beneath the torso.

A personal item belonging to the victim was recovered several yards away from the body.

- November 2, 1994, early afternoon

Scene secured and documented by New York State Police.

No signs of prolonged struggle or restraint observed.

Vehicle later located parked safely along roadway, showing no signs of collision.

- November 3, 1994, medical examiner review

Cause of death determined to have occurred shortly after the vehicle stop.

Findings suggested collapse rather than sudden violent trauma.

Environmental exposure and exhaustion identified as contributing factors.

- November 4, 1994, follow up psychic consultation, approximately 1:00 p.m.

Psychic stated the individual attempted to rest briefly before dying.

Psychic mentioned cold and fatigue as dominant factors.

Medical examiner later confirmed body position consistent with resting collapse rather than impact injury.

- Investigator reaction

Detectives involved privately expressed unease at the accuracy of terrain, body position, and object placement described in advance.

Several officers noted the psychic information influenced the decision to search downhill areas.

Psychic involvement was never referenced in official reports or case summaries.

- Case closure, late November 1994

Case closed through conventional investigative findings.

Psychic consultation remained informal and undocumented.

Retired investigators later acknowledged the consultation as disturbing due to specificity rather than belief.

- Additional consultation after recovery

Psychic stated the victim attempted to rest briefly before succumbing.

Medical examiner later noted body position consistent with collapse rather than sudden trauma.

Psychic also mentioned cold and exhaustion as contributing factors, later supported by autopsy findings.

- Internal department handling

Case was closed with cause of death determined through conventional investigation.

Psychic consultation remained an informal aspect of the case known only to select investigators.

Some officers declined to discuss the consultation afterward due to discomfort rather than skepticism.

- Long term reflections

Retired New York State Police investigators later acknowledged that psychic input influenced search direction in this case.

Officers involved emphasized that the accuracy of nonpublic details was disturbing rather than reassuring.

Case remains one of several examples where psychics provided information later confirmed by physical discovery.

Part 4: HONORABLE MENTIONS from the PARANORMAL POLICE FILES

(These are 15 headlines with brief descriptions of creepy and possibly paranormal police reports that didn't quite have enough information for a full section in this episode, but that are still interesting and I wanted to give them to you.)

1. **Route 44 Phantom Vehicle Calls**

State troopers responded to repeated reports of a car that appeared suddenly and vanished without turning off the roadway.

No disabled vehicles or crash evidence were ever found at reported locations.

2. **Orleans Parish Prison Haunted Cell Block Responses**

New Orleans police officers responded to disturbance calls involving screams from empty jail cells.

Officers reported cell doors slamming despite being electronically locked.

3. **Marfa Lights Border Patrol Sightings**

Texas Rangers and border patrol officers observed lights maneuvering in ways inconsistent with vehicles or aircraft. (I did a Patreon Bonus Episode all about the Marfa Lights with cool pictures of the lights, so RFA Agents already have it, and you could join Patreon for the free week if you want to hear that PBE.)

The Lights appeared to react to patrol movements before disappearing.

4. **San Pedro Courthouse Shadow Figure Reports**

Deputies reported shadow figures moving through closed courtrooms after hours.

Security footage repeatedly showed motion alerts with no visible source.

5. **Route 555 Phantom Hitchhiker Encounters**

State troopers encountered individuals who vanished when patrol cars turned around.

No missing persons matched descriptions provided by officers.

6. **Skinwalker Ranch Deputy Backup Calls**
Sheriff deputies responding to livestock mutilations reported large animal silhouettes immune to gunfire.
Some officers refused solo patrols in the area afterward.
7. **Bodie Ghost Town Ranger Disturbance Logs**
Park rangers reported hearing footsteps and voices in locked buildings.
Rangers found doors open that had been secured minutes earlier.
8. **Cape Hatteras Lighthouse Sheriff Night Calls**
Deputies responded to reports of lights moving inside the closed lighthouse.
No staff or trespassers were located during repeated searches.
9. **Yakima Reservation Tribal Police Bigfoot Reports**
Tribal police officers documented large humanoid sightings near wooded roadways.
Tracks and sounds were reported but never attributed to known wildlife.
10. **Route 66 Phantom Semi Truck Reports**
Highway patrol officers responded to multiple calls involving a truck that vanished at high speed.
No matching vehicles were ever located on radar or traffic cameras.
11. **Alcatraz Island Night Watch Encounters**
Officers and rangers reported cell doors slamming and voices calling out inmate numbers.
Events occurred after the island was fully secured for the night.
12. **Hocking Hills Search and Rescue Anomalies**
Deputies conducting nighttime searches reported voices calling their names from the woods.
Audio recordings captured sounds with no visible source.
13. **Route 20 Time Loss Patrol Reports**
Troopers reported losing track of time during overnight patrols without stopping.
Dash logs showed gaps inconsistent with normal driving patterns.
14. **St. Augustine Lighthouse Sheriff Disturbance Calls**
Deputies responded to reports of children's laughter after hours.
No persons were found, and alarms triggered without explanation. This is a cool one for me because I took a ghost tour to the Lighthouse there and the guide told us that 2 young girls dies in an accident there many decades ago and it is believed that these are the girls people hear.
15. **Area 51 Federal Security Anomalies**
Security personnel reported shadow figures and aerial objects during restricted patrols. Incidents surfaced later through retired officer testimony.
Who knows what's going on there.
